"My Beloved Son"

It came to pass in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth to Galilee, and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And immediately, coming up from the water, He saw the heavens parting and the Spirit descending upon Him like a dove. Then a voice came from heaven, "You are My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." Mark 1:9-11

The Holy Spirit descended on Jesus following His baptism. This was a sign that Jesus' ministry was empowered by the Spirit and would usher in peace between humankind and God. As Jesus rose from the water, God the Father spoke monumental words about who Jesus was. When God called Jesus, My Beloved Son, it was a title of kingship and a designation that Jesus was fully, thoroughly and completely loved by God the Father. Jesus, as the Beloved Son, was God's chosen King and Messiah.

Jesus' baptism account is a beautiful portrayal of the loving union of the Trinity—Father, Son, and Spirit. This moment in His life marked the beginning of His ministry in which He was partaking in the human experience fully as the spotless lamb of God sent to save the world. **Luke 4:18, 19; Isaiah 53:4-6**. Jesus' baptism is an act of humility. He consented to be counted as if He were a sinner, like everyone else. This act foreshadowed the time on the cross when He would die for the sins of all. As **2 Corinthians 5:21** expressed it, "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." This act of exchange, in which Jesus takes our sin and gives to us His righteousness, was symbolically depicted when He was baptized by John.

Jesus came to this world to declare unto us the glory of God the Father. In Him alone, we can have a perfect relationship with our loving Father in heaven. Hear Him when He tells us of God's tenderness and patience and love. **Psalm 145:8; Isaiah 30:8; Romans 8:31, 32.** Hear Him when He calls you to Himself. **Philippians 2:1-4; 2 Timothy 1:10; 1 Peter 2:9.** Hear Him when He says to you, "Come unto Me all ye that labour and are heavy laden." **Matthew 11:28-30.** Hear Him as He speaks these words, "And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do." **John 14:13, 14.** Hear Him also when He says, "Let not your heart be troubled." **John 14:1-3.** And when He says, "Abide in Me and I in you." **John 15:4, 5**, hear Him then.

The most beautiful prayer in the Bible is **John 17** when Jesus has finished His earthly ministry and is praying for His people to have that intimate oneness with the Trinity until He returns the second time to take us Home. It would bring you a blessing to read the entire prayer which is the whole chapter. Also take the time to read His awesome promise in **1 John 2:28, 29 and 3:1-3** where He speaks about those who abide in Him and their relationship with Him when He appears at His coming.

As the world gets further away in time from the Cross of Calvary, more and more everything else sinks beneath the horizon and Jesus Christ alone fills the past as He also fills the present and the future. There is no peace anywhere, except in Jesus Christ—our only Pattern, our only Hope, our only Salvation, our only Guide, our only Friend. The solitary Christ is the all-sufficient Christ. I want to begin by giving God all the glory for the success of this prayer group because He has led in a mighty way. Looking back now, I can see events in my life and realize that it was God who was working on my heart to draw me closer to Him and that is where this story starts.

I had talked to Keilani about starting a young adult Bible study about two years ago, but we were having kids and so were most of our friends, so it was difficult to plan and get a group started.

Shortly after Lee Venden had been here and presented his "All About Jesus" seminar, a Wednesday evening Bible study was started and I was very blessed by it. During this time, I was convicted to spend less time watching TV shows and movies on my phone. A sermon had been shared in the men's ministries group chat. After listening to it, I realized that I need to spend more time seeking the Lord and His will for my life.

It was a Monday in February when I was working on fishing gear in my garage. The thought came to me that I needed to make a change. I listened to a sermon while organizing tackle. In the sermon by Pavel Goia, he was sharing how at one of his churches, they got together and prayed at 6:00 in the morning and miracles happened as God worked in their lives. Between the two sermons, I was convicted that God needed to be a priority in my life. I thought if the early morning prayer group worked for them, it would work for us too, since we have the same God.

Also, at the time, I had invited someone to come to the Bible study who could not come in the evening. I decided to ask the person about attending a morning prayer group, so we can see if this would work for our church. That night I challenged God to wake me up in the morning to pray, so I would know He wanted to spend time with me. I also texted a close friend before I fell asleep, telling him what God had put on my heart.

The next morning, I woke up at 5:45 a.m., which compared to snoozing alarms until 6:45 a.m. was quite early compared to my normal routine. Not only did God wake me up to spend time with Him, but my friend had replied and said, "You need to talk to Randal and Kristin." That morning God led and I spoke to four different people before 7:30 a.m. Two days later, we had our first morning prayer group. Needless to say, God had put it on multiple hearts that we needed to pray together. We met on Tuesdays and Thursdays for a few weeks before God impressed us that we should be meeting more often. It was then that we began to meet every morning except Sabbath.

The Lord has continued to work in my life and I have slept past 5:30 a.m. only four times since starting this journey the beginning of February of this year. I have been blessed by being able to spend time in prayer and study on my own before the group meets for prayer each morning.

God continues to bless our small group in more ways that I can recount. We, as a group, have experienced the Holy Spirit's leading and influence in our lives, directly related to prayers from our group, but those are not my stories to share. I am so excited to share with you that God is working in our lives and I want everyone who is interested to be a part of what God is doing in our community.
