Recently my wife and I were at the pediatrician's office, taking our oneyear old daughter in for a check-up visit. Five years after moving to Ukiah, on a Friday evening during Sabbath preparation, while praising God in song, I heard His call to train myself for ministry. I prayed earnestly, "If this is truly You, Lord, please help me with my tuition costs." A few months later, I received a letter offering five years of full tuition coverage! Andrews was a life-changing journey. My favorite courses were Greek, Hebrew, and Old Testament Exegesis.

In June 2024, I founded an orphanage caring for 37 children and planted a church in Madagascar. Just recently they had nine baptisms. While continuing that ministry, now that I



have my M. Div. degree, I have embraced digital evangelism. Through this platform, I can reach out to people around the world, extending my ministry beyond geographical boundaries to touch lives globally.
