My Most Urgent Need!

There is a growing conviction among many Christians that Christ's second coming is "even at the doors." One of the strongest indicators of this is the current rhetoric and efforts being put forth to unite church and state.

There is a popular revival, sweeping our country and the world, resulting in giving the church influence over the affairs of the state. The assassination of Charlie Kirk has fanned the flame of this revival to an intensity never before witnessed in my lifetime. It will be interesting to witness the effects of his book, that just came off the press about three weeks ago, regarding his convictions and faithful observance of the Seventh-day Saturday Sabbath. If nothing else, it will bring the issue of the Sabbath to the forefront before the world. That could likely bring a knee-jerk reaction by popular church leaders.

"But as the question of enforcing Sunday observance is widely agitated, the event so long doubted and disbelieved is seen to be approaching, and the third message will produce an effect which it could not have had before." (Great Controversy, pp. 605-606, emphasis added)

There will be a period of time when a Sunday law will be "widely agitated." Are we entering this time? Could this be what Jesus spoke about in Matthew 25:6?

"And at midnight a cry was heard: 'Behold, the bridegroom is coming; go out to meet him!'"

Here is the point that is being urged upon my mind. When that cry goes out, according to Jesus in Mat. 25:7 and 8, it will be too late to fill our lives with the oil of the Holy Spirit.

"Then all those virgins arose and trimmed their lamps. And the foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.'"

Therefore, now is the time to make sure our lives are filled with the Holy Spirit! There is no time to waste! It takes time to re-dig spiritual wells that have become cluttered by the things of this world.

Have you ever wondered if heaven is too pure, too holy, too righteous for you to enter as you are now? Nicodemus was confronted with that reality when he sought to dialogue with Jesus one evening. Even though Nicodemus was a member of the 'church board,' a diligent student of the Scripture, and a wealthy and highly respected leader, Jesus shocked him in John 3:3; 5-7 by saying that he was not qualified for heaven as he was.

Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born from above, he cannot see the kingdom of God. Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you,

'You must be born again.' " (Margin)

The topic that is more important than anything else for us as a church is to truly be born again by the Holy Spirit! This is the most essential spiritual preparation needed today! This is the difference between those who enter the door into the wedding and those who are not allowed to enter.

"Many are sensible of their great deficiency, and they read, and pray, and resolve, and yet make no progress. They seem to be powerless to resist temptation. The reason is, **they do not go deep enough. They do not seek for a thorough conversion of the soul**, that the streams which issue from it may be pure, and the deportment may testify that Christ reigns within. All defects of character originate in the heart. Pride, vanity, evil temper, and covetousness proceed from the carnal heart un-renewed by the grace of Christ. If the heart is refined, softened, and ennobled, the words and actions will testify to the fact. When the soul has been **entirely surrendered to God**, there will be a firm reliance upon His promises, and earnest prayer and determined effort to control the words and actions." (Our High Calling, p. 336.4, emphasis added)

Our outward lives may be spotless. We may perfectly obey the letter of the law, but what about the sins of the heart? Do we truly love God and others in the same way as Jesus loves us? That type of love is the proof of being born from above! It is proof that God's power is in control! It is proof of the transforming power of the divine nature! It is proof of being resurrected to a new life! It is proof of the power of the gospel! That type of love experienced in the family circle will spill over to those outside the family, including enemies! The natural heart cannot produce it!

On the other hand, the carnal heart is at enmity with God, and would find heaven a place of unhappiness for them. The carnal heart finds excuses for disobedience and sin, finds excuses for failures, doubts God's power for victory! The carnal heart prefers to read anything but the Bible and Spirit of Prophecy because they bring conviction. The carnal heart can even have a correct theory of the truth, but still lack the power of the Holy Spirit to transform the thoughts and feelings which make up the character.

But the born-again heart loves God supremely and others as himself, loves God's holy law, loves God's standards and principles of righteousness, loves and can't get enough of the Bible, and loves the messages God has graciously given us through His messenger to the Remnant Church. The right-doing they used to hate, they now love! And the wrong-doing they once loved, they now hate! All things have become completely new! Jesus has become their all-in-all! They have found that "Christ in you, (is) the hope of glory"! Their thoughts and feelings are in harmony with God! They have repented of their reliance upon worldly wisdom, standards, and philosophies – repented of their selfishness, and pride. "The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life" has lost their attraction! Their greatest desire is that Jesus will be glorified in their every thought, word and action! They want Jesus to be seen, heard, and known. They want the world to be enlightened with God's glory!

Our (my) greatest need is to be born from above through the power of the Holy Spirit! Today is the day of salvation! Today is the time to make sure our lives are filled with the presence, power, and fruit of the Holy Spirit! My Most Urgent Need! Continued on page 4

Tuesday, 6:30-7:30 p.m. in the Chapel.


Sabbaths, 9-9:30 a.m. in the Chapel and following the worship service, meet in the left front of the sanctuary.

What A Day That Will Be!

Wonders of Creation, The Monterey Trip by Sheldon Schultz cont from Dec. 2025

I spent the morning walking around Moss Landing waiting for the 11 am Wednesday Lecture at MBARI (Monterey Bay Aquarium Research Institute). I had not attended a lecture at MBARI in over 17 years since I left Monterey Bay Academy, where I taught Marine Biology for 9 years—the Lecture was given by Dr. Sonke Johnsen & Steven Haddock, exploring how deep-sea creatures use light in their deep underwater world. The Lecture was terrific, as were the pictures of deep-sea animals that ranged from Comb Jellies that use diffraction to create a rainbow of colors to confuse predators, to fish that are transparent, so predators cannot see them in the limited deep-sea light. The researchers had just released a new book of their findings, with all the images from the lecture, which I procured and had them both sign.

After the lecture, I spent some time looking at MBARI's newest ship, the David Packard, a scientific research vessel. It has a fantastic array of scientific collecting instruments, ranging from autonomous underwater drones to manually operated tethered ROVS. When I taught Marine Biology, I would often enjoy the fruits of MBARI's labors as they shared information with teachers and scientists worldwide, allowing us to incorporate the latest findings into our classroom instruction.

I went to the wharf at the Elkhorn Yacht Club. Wharfs are unique ecosystems in the marine environment, because they float in calm water, but remain at a constant depth. The floats provide a perfect environment for many marine animals, as well as kelp, which prefers a light-filled environment or ambient light, such as under the float. They are never exposed to air or to sudden, radical changes in water temperature. This stability allows for a particular group of marine animals to thrive. I wanted to find some nudibranchs I had never seen there. At the top of my list was the Sorcerer's Dorid, *Polycera atra*, which is known to feed on Byzoans, many of which live on docks. I chose to lie on the dock, face down, hanging over the edge, looking for nudibranchs and anything else I wanted to photograph. The most common things I saw on the docks were Giant Feather Duster Worms (*Eudistylia polymorpha*), with their giant plumes in orange and white. I had never seen them before, but I was after slugs! Where were they? I kept moving on the dock for the next two hours, always lying on my belly, torso hanging over the edge, looking for those elusive slugs. The hard part is that I was looking for a Sea Slug that comes in many different morphs, so that I couldn't choose a single color. They might be mostly black with orange or yellow stripes, or white with orange and black stripes. After about an hour, I found a small one and managed to take a few pictures.



I then headed to Pleasure Point Beach for low tide. Upon arrival, I walked down to the reef with my wetsuit, big dive light and Olympus TG-7 camera. All I could see from the surface was seagrass and what appeared to be shallow indentations in the rocks. I started to snorkel through the small holes. I soon realized that the small-looking pools were full of unique rock overhangs, forming caves that extended far beneath the surface. In those small caves, I found rockfish, sponges, sea squirts, and yes, some nudibranchs. The first was a very large Hilton Aeolid, about 2 inches long. I shot pictures of it for several minutes, as it was so large. As these nudibranchs feed on hydroids and other nudibranchs, they are fast and serious predators.



The next day, I was off to Moss Landing again to look for other nudibranchs. I snorkeled for 2 hours looking for nudibranchs, but didn't find a single one, due to

poor visibility. Later, I knew I wanted to snorkel in the tunnels that go under Jetty Road just north of the harbor at Elkhorn Slough. Due to the fast current, I would have to snorkel near the entrance to the tunnels, going against the current. I got into the water at the Tube and only had about 3-4 minutes of slack tide before I was too nervous to enter again. I found some incredible animals congregating in the fast-moving water—sponges and anemones that I found nowhere else. After the tide flipped at 12:40 p.m., I was off to the tide pool near the



Kissing Rock View Point. As I was looking through the tide-pools, I found several White-speckled Nudibranchs, *Doriopsilla fulva*.
